

Tone 7 Orthros Gospel 2

SPECIAL HYMNS OF THE DAY (SMALL ENTRANCE):

First to be chanted as the priest exits the Altar at the Small Entrance is the Resurrection Apolytikion in Tone 7 (See p. 172 in the Divine Liturgy books.)

Then, the usual Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) in Tone 2 is chanted:
Δεῦτε προσκυνήσωμεν καὶ προσπέσωμεν Χριστῷ. Σῶσον ἡμᾶς Υἱὲ Θεοῦ,
ὁ ἀναστὰς ἐκ νεκρῶν , ψάλλοντάς σοι· Ἀλληλούϊα. "Come let us worship and fall down before Christ.
Save us O Son of God, who arose from the dead. We sing to you, Alleluia."

After this, the Resurrection Apolytikion is repeated, followed by that for the patron saint of our Church: Κανόνα πίστεως καὶ εἰκόνα πραότητος, ἐγκρατείας Διδάσκαλον, ἀνέδειξέ σε τῆ ποίμνη σου, ἡ τῶν πραγμάτων ἀλήθεια· διὰ τοῦτο ἐκτήσω τῆ ταπεινώσει τὰ ὑψηλά, τῆ πτωχεία τὰ πλούσια, Πάτερ Ἱεράρχα Νικόλαε· πρέσβευε Χριστῷ τῷ Θεῷ, σωθῆναι τὰς ψυχὰς ἡμῶν.

The truth of things have revealed you to your flock as a rule of faith, an icon of meekness, and a teacher of temperance; for this cause you have achieved the heights by humility, riches by poverty. O Father and Hierarch Nicholas, intercede with Christ God that our souls be saved.

Finally, we hear the Kontakion in Tone 4 for the Entrance into the Temple of the Theotokos (Nov. 21):
Ο καθαρώτατος ναός τού Σωτήρος, η πολυτίμητος παστάς καί Παρθένος, τό Ιερόν θησαύρισμα τής δόξης τού Θεού, σήμερον εισάγεται, εν τώ οίκω Κυρίου, τήν χάριν συνεισάγουσα, τήν εν Πνευματι θείω, ήν ανυμνούσιν Άγγελοι Θεού, Αύτη υπάρχει σκηνή επουράνιος.

Today is the prelude of God's pleasure and the proclamation of man's salvation. The Virgin is clearly made manifest in the temple of God and foretells Christ to all. Let us also cry out to her with mighty voice, "Hail, fulfillment of the Creator's dispensation."

OTICE FOR ALL ORGANIZATIONS OF ST. NICHOLAS: To organize and prioritize the daily needs of St. Nicholas Cathedral, our maintenance staff has adopted a task-list system, prepared with their input, which allots time for routine, seasonal and unexpected needs of our facilities. Employees are required to submit a check list of tasks accomplished daily to the Office Manager (OM) who, in turn, confirms the work has been completed. Any additional task requested of the maintenance staff must be scheduled through the OM. EXAMPLES INCLUDE: running errands, emptying deliveries, setting up tables and chairs, taking something to storage, etc. The OM is responsible for all scheduling of help, including extra personnel needed for church functions. We have established a proven labor pool that must be respected & used efficiently. All organizations are asked to adhere to this policy.





ECCLESIASTICAL MUSIC MINISTRY AT THE CATHEDRAL

You are cordially invited!





Our Cathedral is graced by two music ministries grounded in tradition that we hope you will consider participating in: The first is rooted at the Analogion (the Chanter Bookstand). Our Analogion Ministry, blessed by the volunteer service of Dr. Nick Giannoukakis, invites and welcomes anyone with some musical ability, especially the younger generation, to join and learn the beautiful and 1200 year-old tradition of Byzantine hymnology and chant. Those who faithfully adhere to the ministry will not only have an opportunity to grow musically, but more importantly, will solidify their understanding of Greek, gain an appreciation for the structure of the services, and a better insight into our Orthodox faith and its theology through a comprehension of the hymns. With the exception of the summer months (June-August), the Ministry will focus on the Sunday Orthros and the occasional Vespers, in addition to the evening services of Lent and Holy Week. Between June and early September, the Ministry will also focus on the Holy and Divine Liturgy.

Dr. Giannoukakis, who was distinguished and tonsured as Protopsaltis by Metropolitan Maximos in 1998, and noted to be among the "who is who" of Byzantine Chanters in a historical compendium published in Greece in 1994, is also the only chanter in our Metropolis to hold a certificate and diploma in Byzantine Music from a Greek Music Conservatory. Dr. Giannoukakis, personally-trained by renowned and respected Greek chanters (Constantin Lagouros, Georgios Syrkas, Emmanuel Hatzimarkos), offers music to the highest possible standards of the Great Church of Christ (the Ecumenical Patriarchate) and has successfully trained young and old individuals for more than 25 years. The second is rooted in the rich polyphonic innovations of the late Rudolph Agraphiotis who in the early 1900s, first composed the lyrical Liturgy conducted in our church to this day. Some of the choir members are among those who came together to constitute the first choir directed by Mr. Agraphiotis. Today, the choir is in the very capable hands of Mr. Steve Andrews who directs it as another of our Cathedral's volunteers. The choir can be heard during the Divine Liturgy for most of the year's Sunday services as well as at the services for Holy Thursday, Friday, and Saturday.

The Choir invites and welcomes anyone with some musical ability, especially the younger generation, to join. As it is written: "He who delights in the Lord, and walks in the Light will not stumble" (From the Doxastikon of the Orthros of the 5th Sunday of Lent).

To the Most Reverend Clergy, Venerable Monastics, and Devout Faithful of the Holy Orthodox Churches in the Americas:

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Each year on the Sunday before Thanksgiving, the Orthodox faithful in the United States come together to give thanks to God for all his blessings, and for the privilege of serving the least of our brethren. The Assembly of Bishops has called this Sw1day A Day of Shai·i.ng, for the message IOCC brings is one of sharing God's good gifts to us, reiterating Christ's call to serve Him by loving and serving one another.

As the official humanitarian agency of the Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of the United States of America, International Orthodox Christian Charities, or IOCC, is our vehicle to extend to others the great mercy that Christ has shown us. Since its creation in 1992, IOCC has served people around the world struggling in the face of war, famine, natural disaster, and economic hardship so that they may have the means to live with dignity, respect, aid hope.

In 2017, IOCC's 25th anniversary year, IOCC has extended that hope to many ai·ow1d the world. IOCC has helped Syrian refugees throughout Greece, Jordan, Lebanon, Romania and Serbia, as well as those Syrians displaced in their own country, by providing food, water, shelter, and medicine. IOCC has offered economic opportunity to farmers in northern Greece grappling with the ongoing financial crisis, and trained healthcare workers in Ethiopia so that they can customize wheelchairs for people with disabilities. IOCC has helped to reconstruct storm-damaged schools in Haiti; rebuilt homes destroyed by natural disasters here in the United States; and offered emotional and spiritual care after Hunicai1es Harvey and Irma. With assistance offered in the spirit of Christ's love, farmers in Kosovo have increased their harvests, entrepreneurs in Bosnia-Herzegovina have grown their businesses, and flood survivors in Serbia have started anew.

"Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them" (1 Cor. 12:4-6). Each one of us brings unique gifts to our service of Christ; so too the ministry of IOCC is varied in its manifestations yet unified in purpose. That unity characterizes our ability as one Church to serve those in need, near and far, reaching around the world in Christ's love. As we thank God for His goodness to us, let us not forget His children near and far facing difficulty, and let us recommit to serving those in need, to being Christ's hands on Earth.

During this blessed holiday season, may the LORD shine His mercy upon you & your family, bring peace into your homes & your hearts.
