

### **SPECIAL HYMNS OF THE DAY (SMALL ENTRANCE):**

First to be chanted as the priest exits the Altar at the Small Entrance is the Resurrection Apolytikion in Tone 7 (See p. 172 in the Divine Liturgy books.)

#### *Then, the usual* **Eisodikon** (**Entrance Hymn**) *in Tone* **2** *is chanted*:

Δεῦτε προσκυνήσωμεν καὶ προσπέσωμεν Χριστῷ. Σῶσον ἡμᾶς Υἱὲ Θεοῦ, ὁ ἀναστὰς ἐκ νεκρῶν (ἢ ὁ ἐν Ἁγίοις θαυμαστός), ψάλλοντάς σοι ἀλληλούϊα.

"Come let us worship and fall down before Christ. Save us O Son of God, who arose from the dead. We sing to you, Alleluia."

After this, the Resurrection Apolytikion is repeated. Then we hear the hymn for The Theotokos:

Λαοὶ νῦν κροτήσωμεν, δεῦτε τὰς χεῖρας πιστῶς, καὶ ἄσωμεν ἄσμασι, τῇ Θεομήτορι, ἐν πόθῳ κραυγάζοντες· Χαῖρε ἡ προστασία πάντων τῶν δεομένων· χαῖρε ἡ σωτηρία τῶν τιμώντων σε πόθῳ· χαῖρε ἡ τῷ παραλύτῳ τὴν ἴασιν βραβεύσασα.

O come, all you people, and let us in faith clap our hands and sing sacred songs to her who is the Mother of God, and longingly cry aloud: "Rejoice, O protection of all those who entreat you; the salvation of those who honor you with longing; rejoice, O Lady who restored the paralyzed man to health."

#### We also hear the Apolytikion for the Greatmartyr Thekla (Tone 3):

Θείου κήρυκος διδασκαλίας, πόθφ κτίστου σου ἀναφλεχθεῖσα, τῶν γεηρῶν ὡς ῥεόντων ἡλόγησας· καὶ σεαυτὴν ἱερὸν καλλιέργημα, τῷ Θεῷ δοῦσα ποινῶν κατετόλμησας. Θέκλα ἔνδοξε, Παύλου τοῦ θείου συνέκδημε, τὸν σὸν Νυμφίον Χριστὸν ἰκέτευε, δωρήσασθαι ἡμῖν τὸ μέγα ἔλεος.

All aflame with love for your Creator, from the teachings of the sacred preacher, you disregarded as fleeting all things mundane. And being bold in the face of the penalties, you gave yourself as a beautiful gift to God. Thecla, glorious companion of the Apostle Paul, we pray you entreat your Bridegroom, Christ, and ask Him to grant us His great mercy.

#### After that, the Apolytikion for the Patron Saint of our church is chanted:

Κανόνα πίστεως καὶ εἰκόνα πραότητος, ἐγκρατείας Διδάσκαλον, ἀνέδειξέ σε τῇ ποίμνῃ σου, ἡ τῶν πραγμάτων ἀλήθεια· διὰ τοῦτο ἐκτήσω τῇ ταπεινώσει τὰ ὑψηλά, τῇ πτωχείᾳ τὰ πλούσια, Πάτερ Ἱεράρχα Νικόλαε· πρέσβευε Χριστῷ τῷ Θεῷ, σωθῆναι τὰς ψυχὰς ἡμῶν.

The truth of things have revealed you to your flock as a rule of faith, an icon of meekness, and a teacher of temperance; for this cause you have achieved the heights by humility, riches by poverty. O Father and Hierarch Nicholas, intercede with Christ God that our souls be saved.

#### Finally, we hear the Kontakion in Tone 4 of the Theotokos:

Προστασία τῶν Χριστιανῶν ἀκαταίσχυντε, μεσιτεία πρὸς τὸν Ποιητὴν ἀμετάθετε. Μὴ παρίδῃς άμαρτωλῶν δεήσεων φωνάς, ἀλλὰ πρόφθασον, ὡς ἀγαθή, εἰς τὴν βοήθειαν ἡμῶν, τῶν πιστῶς κραυγαζόντων σοι· Τάχυνον εἰς πρεσβείαν, καὶ σπεῦσον εἰς ἱκεσίαν, ἡ προστατεύουσα ἀεί, Θεοτόκε, τῶν τιμώντων σε.

A protection of Christians unshamable, Intercessor to our Holy Maker, unwavering, Please reject not The prayerful cries of those who are in sin. Instead, come to us, for you are good; Your loving help bring unto us, Who are crying in faith to you: Hasten to intercede And speed now to supplicate, As a protection for all time, Theotokos, for those who honor you.

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings which are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

## A TRIP DOWN MEMORY LANE

On June 19, 1969, a group of parishioners sixty years old or older responded to a letter from Fr. George Scoulas to attend a luncheon sponsored by the St. Nicholas Philoptochos. "The purpose of this unique gathering was to initiate a program of activities for this age group to share companionship in a church-sponsored organization." Thus was born the St.

Nicholas Sixty Club as reported in a brief history by the late Jerry Vondas, 37 years later. The first committee consisted of Peter Zikos, Despina Branting & Helen Harris; the latter two became the club's first advisors.

According to Mr. Vondas' account the first get together was attended by 58 people including His Grace Bishop Gerasimos, and by 2006 the Sixty Club had an enrollment of 240, including members from our sister churches. Their first travel activity was an overnight trip to Washington, D.C.

Besides the many varieties of luncheons and dinners, there have been dozens of day trips and multi-day outings from New England to Savannah, from NYC to Mackinaw Island.

Recently our most popular activity has been attending numerous theater productions, often followed by dinner at local restaurants. We have had "Slider Lunches", a Zentangle demonstration, a very successful "Mystery and Masterpieces Party", a very informative program on "End of Life Decisions," and a delightfully entertaining Winter Social Luncheon. We expect to reschedule the CPR demonstration shortly. And the Planning Committee is always open to suggestions. Check Sunday bulletins for our next meeting.


